4-10.10.1899: 56/64 shares sold to John Stephens and 5/64 to Thomas H. Jones (Joseph Edward Fisher, manager), Swansea.

18.12.1901: Managing owner became Thomas H. Jones, Swansea.

8.3.1907: Wrecked on the Haak Grounds, Netherlands whilst on a voyage from Fowey to Hamburg with a cargo of china clay.
